

Should Christians go chasing after miracles and signs conferences?

Christians should not chase after signs and wonders conferences, because biblical teaching urges believers to focus on Jesus Christ and the gospel rather than miraculous spectacles.

What the Bible Teaches

Wrong motives: Jesus warned that people who constantly demand signs often miss the true spiritual message.

Secondary role: Miracles in the Bible were meant to point people to God, not become the main goal of faith.

Risks of Chasing Conferences

Spiritual deception: Focusing on a show or a charismatic speaker leaves people open to false teachings.

Lack of growth: Adrenaline from a big event does not replace daily prayer, reading the Bible, and quiet spiritual maturity.

Disappointment: Constantly traveling to find a miracle often leaves Christians feeling empty and unhappy when life remains hard.

A Better Approach

Seek God, not gifts: Focus on knowing God personally rather than trying to get a supernatural experience from Him.

Value daily habits: Grow your faith through ordinary acts of love, service, and studying the Bible.

Let God choose: Trust that God still performs miracles but let them happen naturally instead of running after them.
