#### **(Alef)** (Hebrew)

- <sup>1</sup> How happy are those whose way of life is blameless, who live by the *Torah* of *ADONAI*!
- <sup>2</sup> How happy are those who observe his instruction, who seek him wholeheartedly!
- <sup>3</sup> They do nothing wrong but live by his ways.
- <sup>4</sup>You laid down your precepts for us to observe with care.
- <sup>5</sup> May my ways be steady
- in observing your laws.
- <sup>6</sup>Then I will not be put to shame, since I will have fixed my sight on all your *mitzvot*.
- <sup>7</sup>I thank you with a sincere heart
- as I learn your <mark>righteous rulings.</mark>
- <sup>8</sup> I will observe your laws; don't completely abandon me!

#### コ (Bet)

- <sup>9</sup> How can a young man keep his way pure?
- By guarding it according to your word.
- <sup>10</sup> I seek you with all my heart;

don't let me stray from your *mitzvot*.

- <sup>11</sup> I treasure your word in my heart,
- so that I won't sin against you.
- <sup>12</sup> Blessed are you, *ADONAI*!

Teach me your laws.

- <sup>13</sup> I proclaim with my mouth
- all the rulings you have spoken.
- <sup>14</sup>I rejoice in the way of your instruction

more than in any kind of wealth.

<sup>15</sup> I will meditate on your precepts and keep my eyes on your ways.

<sup>16</sup> I will find my delight in your regulations. I will not forget your word.

## λ (Gimel)

- <sup>17</sup> Deal generously with your servant; then I will live and observe your word.
- <sup>18</sup> Open my eyes, so that I will see wonders from your *Torah*.
- <sup>19</sup> Though I'm just a wanderer on the earth, don't hide your *mitzvot* from me.
- <sup>20</sup>I am continually consumed with longing for your rulings.
- <sup>21</sup> You rebuke the proud, the cursed, who stray from your *mitzvot*.
- <sup>22</sup> Remove scorn and contempt from me, because I observe your instruction.
- <sup>23</sup> Even when princes sit and plot against me, your servant meditates on your laws.
- <sup>24</sup> Also your instructions are my delight; they are my counselors.

#### **⊤** (Dalet)

- <sup>25</sup> I lie prostrate in the dust; revive me, in keeping with your word.
- <sup>26</sup> I told you of my ways, and you answered me; teach me your laws.
- <sup>27</sup> Make me understand the way of your precepts, and I will meditate on your wonders.
- <sup>28</sup> I am melting away from anxiety and grief;

renew my strength, in keeping with your word.

<sup>29</sup> Keep deceitful ways far from me, and favor me with your *Torah*.

<sup>30</sup> I choose the way of trust;

I set your rulings [before me].

<sup>31</sup>I cling to your instruction;

ADONAI, don't let me be put to shame!

<sup>32</sup> I will run the way of your *mitzvot*,

for you have broadened my understanding.

## ה (Heh)

- <sup>33</sup> Teach me, *ADONAI*, the way of your laws; keeping them will be its own reward for me.
- <sup>34</sup> Give me understanding; then I will keep your *Torah*; I will observe it with all my heart.
- <sup>35</sup> Guide me on the path of your *mitzvot*, for I take pleasure in it.
- <sup>36</sup> Bend my heart toward your instructions and not toward selfish gain.
- <sup>37</sup> Turn my eyes away from worthless things; with your ways, give me life.
- <sup>38</sup> Fulfill your promise, which you made to your servant, which you made to those who fear you.
- <sup>39</sup> Avert the disgrace which I dread, for your rulings are good.
- <sup>40</sup> See how I long for your precepts; in your righteousness, give me life!

#### 1 (Vav)

- <sup>41</sup> May your grace come to me, *ADONAI*, your salvation, as you promised;
- <sup>42</sup> then I will have an answer for those who taunt me;

for I trust in your word.

- <sup>43</sup> Don't take away completely my power to speak the truth; for I put my hope in your rulings;
- <sup>44</sup> and I will keep your *Torah* always, forever and ever.
- <sup>45</sup> I will go wherever I like,

for I have sought your precepts.

- <sup>46</sup> I will speak of your instructions even to kings without being ashamed.
- <sup>47</sup> I will delight myself in your *mitzvot*, which I have loved.
- <sup>48</sup> I will lift my hands to your *mitzvot*, which I love; and I will meditate on your laws.

# ን (Zayin)

- <sup>49</sup> Remember your promise to your servant, through which you have given me hope.
- <sup>50</sup> In my distress my comfort is this: that your promise gives me life.
- <sup>51</sup> Though the arrogant scorn me completely, I have not turned away from your *Torah*.
- <sup>52</sup> ADONAI, I keep in mind your age-old rulings; in them I take comfort.
- <sup>53</sup> Fury seizes me when I think of the wicked, because they abandon your *Torah*.
- <sup>54</sup> Your laws have become my songs wherever I make my home.
- <sup>55</sup> I remember your name, *ADONAI*, at night; and I observe your *Torah*.
- <sup>56</sup> This [comfort] has come to me, because I observe your precepts.

## n (Het)

<sup>57</sup> ADONAI, I say that my task is to observe your words. <sup>58</sup> I beg your favor with my whole heart; show pity to me, in keeping with your promise. <sup>59</sup> I thought about my ways and turned my feet toward your instruction. <sup>60</sup> I hurry, I don't delay, to observe your *mitzvot*. <sup>61</sup> Even when the cords of the wicked close around me, I don't forget your *Torah*. <sup>62</sup> At midnight I rise to give you thanks because of your righteous rulings. <sup>63</sup> I am a friend of all who fear you, of those who observe your precepts. <sup>64</sup> The earth, *ADONAI*, is full of your grace; teach me your laws.

#### ບ (Tet)

<sup>65</sup> You have treated your servant well,
ADONAI, in keeping with your word.
<sup>66</sup> Teach me good judgment and knowledge,
because I trust in your mitzvot.
<sup>67</sup> Before I was humbled, I used to go astray;

<sup>73</sup> Your hands made and formed me: give me understanding, so I can learn your mitzvot. <sup>74</sup> Those who fear you rejoice at the sight of me, because I put my hope in your word. <sup>75</sup> I know, *ADONAI*, that your rulings are righteous, that even when you humble me you are faithful. <sup>76</sup> Let your grace comfort me, in keeping with your promise to your servant. <sup>77</sup> Show me pity, and I will live, for your *Torah* is my delight. <sup>78</sup> Let the proud be ashamed, because they wrong me with lies; as for me, I will meditate on your precepts. <sup>79</sup> Let those who fear you turn to me, along with those who know your instruction. <sup>80</sup> Let my heart be pure in your laws, so that I won't be put to shame.

<sup>81</sup> I am dying to know your salvation;
my hope is in your word.
<sup>82</sup> My eyes fail from watching for your promise;
I ask, "When will you comfort me?"
<sup>83</sup> For I have shriveled like a wineskin in a smoky room;
still, I don't forget your laws.
<sup>84</sup> How long can your servant stay alive?
When will you bring judgment on my persecutors?

85 The arrogant have dug pits for me to fall in; this is not in keeping with your *Torah*!
86 All your *mitzvot* [show your] faithfulness; they are hounding me with lies; help me!
87 They have nearly ended my life on earth, but I have not abandoned your precepts.
88 In keeping with your grace, revive me; and I will observe your spoken instructions.

## く (Lamed)

<sup>89</sup> Your word continues forever, *ADONAI*, firmly fixed in heaven;

<sup>90</sup> your faithfulness through all generations; you established the earth, and it stands.

<sup>91</sup> Yes, it stands today, in keeping with your rulings; for all things are your servants.

<sup>92</sup> If your *Torah* had not been my delight, I would have perished in my distress.

<sup>93</sup> I will never forget your precepts, for with them you have made me alive.

<sup>94</sup> I am yours; save me because I seek your precepts.
<sup>95</sup> The wicked hope to destroy me, but I focus on your instruction.
<sup>96</sup> I see the limits of all perfection, but your *mitzvah* has no bounds.

#### מ (Mem)

<sup>97</sup> How I love your *Torah*!
I meditate on it all day.
<sup>98</sup> I am wiser than my foes,
because your *mitzvot* are mine forever.

<sup>99</sup> I have more understanding than all my teachers, because I meditate on your instruction.
<sup>100</sup> I understand more than my elders, because I keep your precepts.
<sup>101</sup> I keep my feet from every evil way, in order to observe your word.
<sup>102</sup> I don't turn away from your rulings, because you have instructed me.
<sup>103</sup> How sweet to my tongue is your promise, truly sweeter than honey in my mouth!
<sup>104</sup> From your precepts I gain understanding; this is why I hate every false way.

#### (Nun) د

<sup>105</sup> Your word is a lamp for my foot and light on my path. <sup>106</sup> I have sworn an oath and confirmed it, that I will observe your righteous rulings. <sup>107</sup> I am very much distressed; ADONAI, give me life, in keeping with your word. <sup>108</sup> Please accept my mouth's voluntary offerings, ADONAI; and teach me your rulings. <sup>109</sup> I am continually taking my life in my hands, yet I haven't forgotten your *Torah*. <sup>110</sup> The wicked have set a trap for me, yet I haven't strayed from your precepts. <sup>111</sup>I take your instruction as a permanent heritage, because it is the joy of my heart. <sup>112</sup>I have resolved to obey your laws forever, at every step.

<sup>125</sup> I am your servant; give me understanding, so that I can know your instruction.

<sup>126</sup> The time has come for *ADONAI* to act, because they are breaking your *Torah*.

<sup>127</sup> Therefore I love your *mitzvot* 

more than gold, more than fine gold.

128 Thus I direct my steps by [your] precepts;
every false way I hate.

- <sup>154</sup> Plead my cause, and redeem me; in keeping with your promise, revive me.
- <sup>155</sup> Salvation is far away from the wicked,

because they don't seek your laws.

156 Great is your compassion, *ADONAI*;
in keeping with your rulings, revive me.

157 Although my persecutors and foes are many,
I have not turned away from your instruction.

158 I look at traitors with disgust,
because they don't keep your word.

159 See how I love your precepts, *ADONAI*;
