Redeemed & Righteous!

Isaiah 51:11 Therefore the *redeemed* of the Lord shall return and come with singing unto Zion; and everlasting joy shall be upon their head: they shall obtain gladness and joy; and sorrow and mourning shall flee away.

Isaiah 61:10a I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my soul shall be joyful in my God; for He hath clothed me with the garments of salvation, He hath covered me with the robe of *righteousness*..

2 Corinthians 5:21 For He (Jesus) has made Him to be sin (offering) for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the *righteousness* of God in Him.

Galatians 3:13 Christ hath *redeemed* us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangs on a tree:

Psalm 107:2 Let the *redeemed* of the Lord say so, whom He has redeemed from the hand of the enemy

Psalm 136:24 And has redeemed us from our enemies: for His mercy endureth for ever

Philippians 3:9 And be found in Him, not having mine own *righteousness*, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith:

Genesis 15:6 And he (Abraham) believed in the Lord; and He counted it to him for righteousness.

1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all *unrighteousness*.

Ephesians 6:14 Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of *righteousness*;

Psalm 37:3-6 Trust in the Lord and do good; so shall you dwell in the land, and verily you shall be fed. Delight yourself also in the Lord: and He shall give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way unto the Lord; trust also in Him; and He shall bring it to pass and He shall bring forth your *righteousness* as the light, and your judgment as the noonday.

1 Corinthians 1:30 But of Him are you in Christ Jesus, who of God is made unto us wisdom, and *righteousness*, and sanctification, and *redemption*:

Hebrews 12:2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith;

1 Peter 1:3-25p Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to His abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance *incorruptible*, and undefiled, and that fades not away, reserved in heaven for you, who are *kept by the power of God through faith* unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time... 17. And if you call on the Father, who without respect of persons judges according to every man's work, pass the time of your sojourning here in fear: forasmuch as you know that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; but with the precious Blood of Christ, as of a Lamb without blemish and without spot: Who verily was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you, who by Him do believe in God, that raised Him up from the dead, and gave Him glory; that your faith and hope might be in God... 25. But the Word of the Lord endures forever. And this is the word which by the gospel is preached unto you.

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John 16:8-11 "And when He (The Holy Spirit) is come, He will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment: Of sin, because they believe not on me; Of righteousness, because I go to my Father, and you see me no more; Of judgment, because the prince of this world is judged."
