

The Great I AM

Exodus 3:14 And God said unto Moses, "**I Am That I Am**": and He said, "Thus shall you say unto the children of Israel, 'I Am has sent me unto you'".

Psalms 46:10 (Desist,-YLT) *Be still, and know that I am God*: I will be exalted among the heathen, **I will** be exalted in the earth.

John 6:26-35-69 And Jesus said unto them, **I am the bread of life**: he that cometh to Me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on Me shall never thirst. (Note John 6:48 & 51)

John 8:12 Then spoke Jesus again unto them, saying, **I am the light of the world**: he that follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life.

John 8:58 Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, **I say** unto you, *Before Abraham was, I am*.

John 10:9&10 **I am the door**: by Me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture. The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: **I am come** that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

John 11:25 Jesus said unto her, **I am the resurrection**, and **the life**: he that believes in Me, though he were dead, yet shall he live:

John 14:6 Jesus said unto him, "**I am the way, the truth, and the life**: no man comes unto the Father, but by Me".

John 15:5 **I am the vine**, you are the branches: he that abideth in Me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: **for without Me** you can do nothing.

John 18:5-6 They answered him, Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus said unto them, "**I am He**". And Judas also, which betrayed Him, stood with them. As soon then as He had said unto them, "*I am He*", they went backward, and fell to the ground.

Revelation 1:8 & 22:13 - **I am Alpha and Omega**, the beginning and the ending, says the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty. (**Revelation 21:6** I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end. I will give unto him that is athirst of the fountain of the water of life freely.)

Isaiah 41:10 - **I am Alpha and Omega**, the beginning and the end, the first and the last.

Hebrews 12:2 Looking unto Jesus the **author and finisher** of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

John 1:1-3&14 **In the beginning was the Word**, and the Word **was with God**, and the Word **was God**. The same was in the beginning with God. All things **were made by Him**; and without Him was not any thing made that was made. And the Word **was made flesh**, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) **full of grace and truth**.

Matthew 14:26-27, 29 And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, It is a spirit; and they cried out for fear. But straightway Jesus spoke unto them, saying, "Be of good cheer; **it is I; be not afraid**" & "**Come**"...

Communion:

John 6:51 I am *the living bread* which came down from heaven: if any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever: and the bread that I will give is **My flesh**, which I will give for the life of the world.

1 Peter 5:5-11

5. Likewise, you younger, submit yourselves unto the elder. Yea, **all of you be subject one to another**, and be clothed with **humility**: for God resists the proud, and giveth grace to the humble.

6. Humble yourselves therefore **under** the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you *in due time*:

7. Casting all your care upon Him; for He cares for you.

8. Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walks about, seeking whom he may devour:

9. Whom resist steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same afflictions are accomplished in your brethren that are in the world.

10. But the God **of all grace**, who hath **called us** unto His eternal glory by Christ Jesus, **after** that you have suffered a while, make you perfect, stablish, strengthen, **settle** you.

11. To Him **be glory and dominion** for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The phrase translated "I am who I am" in Hebrew is *ehyeh asher ehyeh*.

The word *ehyeh* is the first person common singular of the verb to be. It would be used in any number of normal situations: "I am watching the sheep," "I am walking on the road," or "I am his father."

However, when used as a stand-alone description, **I AM is the ultimate statement** of self-sufficiency, self-existence, and immediate presence. God's existence is not contingent upon anyone else.

His plans are not contingent upon any circumstances. He promises that He will be what He will be; that is, He will be the eternally constant God. He stands, ever-present and unchangeable, completely sufficient in Himself to do what He wills to do and to accomplish what He wills to accomplish.

In the Greek the "I Am" is *ἐγώ εἰμι*, (ego eimi)

The phrase "**ego eimi**" is the first person singular present active indicative of the Greek verb *eimi*, meaning "to be" or "to exist". Literally, it translates as "I am" or "I exist".

In Greek, it can function in several ways: to express simple existence, identification, relationship, or predication. For example, in Luke 1:18, Zechariah says, "I am an old man" (*ego eimi*), which is a natural, predicated use.

The Trial: When asked if He is the Son of the Blessed, Jesus replies, "I am" (*ego eimi*) in Mark 14:62 and Luke 22:70.
